Greek: pas **Definition:** all, every

Usage: all, the whole, every kind of it. - "each and every "part(s) of a totality"

The emphasis of the total picture then is on "one piece at a time", then focuses on the part(s) making up the whole – viewing the whole in terms of the individual parts.

When 'pas' (**all**) modifies a word with the definite article (**the** people) it has an "extensive-intensive" force.

This reveals the heart of God for the world and it is nothing new.

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A covenant in the ancient world was similar to what we in the modern world would call a contract, treaty, or will.

Each covenant established ...

-the basis of a relationship,
-the conditions for that relationship,
-the promises of the relationship,
and

-the consequences if those conditions were unmet.

One of the most familiar examples of a covenant is marriage.

Unconditional

A unilateral commitment that is not contingent on the fulfillment of an 'IF' clause.

I will do 'A' no matter what you do... ..."no ifs, ands, or buts".

I will do 'A' if you do 'B'... ...if you don't do 'B,' the deal is off.

Conditional

A bilateral commitment that is contingent on the fulfillment of an 'IF' clause.
