...from *Lemon vs. Kurtzman* (1971) which stated that any religious content that did not have a 'secular purpose' was unacceptable in a public forum under the 'Establishment Clause' of the First Amendment.


In *Van Orden vs. Perry* (2005), the Court permits the Ten Commandments be included in displays if they are not conspicuous above other historical, legal, and cultural documents and/or milestones.

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First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution

Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof, or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the government for a redress of grievances.

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


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
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'righteousness' is rooted in truth and blossoms into humility.
