Matthew 21 - Triumphal Entry of Palm Sunday

- 9 And the crowds that went before Him and that followed Him were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!"
- 10 And when He entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred up, saying, "Who is this?"
- 11 And the crowds said, "This is the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth of Galilee."

Matthew 21 - Jesus cleanses the Temple

- 13 He said to them,
 "It is written, My house shall be called a house of prayer, but you make it a den of robbers." (Isaiah 56:7)
- 14 (heals the lame and the blind)
- 15 But when the chief priests and the scribes saw the wonderful things that He did, and the children crying out in the temple, "Hosanna to the Son of David!" they were indignant.

Matthew 21- Jesus curses the fig tree

...it 'proclaimed' to be authentic on the outside with it's leaves but failed to produce figs....
It failed to live out the true fruit of the Spirit of God.

Matthew 21 - Parable of the two sons

...one who claimed to obey and did not, the other claimed he would not obey but ultimately did....

actions that actually revealed their true hearts.

Matthew 21 - Parable of the tenants

...those who had been given the privilege of living in the kingdom but ultimately abused that privilege..... that privilege would be taken away and given to those who would be faithful stewards.

Matthew 21: 45-46

- 45 When the chief priests and the Pharisees heard His parables, they perceived that He was speaking about them.
- 46 And although they were seeking to arrest Him, they feared the crowds, because they held Him to be a prophet.

Matthew 22- Parable of the wedding feast

...depicting this glorious event which was scorned by those whom we would expect to be invited and enjoyed by those who never dreamed of being included but felt honored to be invited.

Matthew 22- Paying taxes to Caesar

...deflecting the Pharisees efforts to trap Jesus by simply telling them to render what is appropriate to whatever authority.... whether that be the trinkets of Caesar or the royalty of God.

Matthew 22- Sadducees and the Resurrection

...Jesus debunks their twisted view of rejecting the eternal dimension of the human soul....

He affirms that there is no such thing as annihilation but that everyone will be resurrected, either to eternal life or eternal death.

Matthew 22- Affirming the Great Commandment

...to love the the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.....
to love your neighbor as yourself.
