# II Corinthians 1:3-4

- 4 who <u>comforts</u> us in all our afflictions, so that we may be able to <u>comfort</u> those who are in any affliction, with the <u>comfort</u> with which we ourselves are <u>comforted</u> by God.

# Character aracter of God is such that we can know Him, admire Him, and trust Him in a way that changes everything about the trajectory of our lives.



## Core

e core of the gospel is crystal clear that the righteousness of God is only possible through the work of Christ who became sin our our behalf so that righteousness could be imparted to us by His grace.

# Control

We relinquish control of our live to Christ, whose love is the only source of real life and through whom we have died along with Him, so that we can live along with Him.

# Creation

We have become a new creature in Christ, and a desperately needed experience in light of the dead end road we found ourselves on paved with the road kill of our sin.

### II Corinthians 5:20-21

19 that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to Himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation.

Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ,

God making His appeal through us.

We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God.

For our sake He made Him to be sin, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God.

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- 2 For He says,

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Four score and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent, a new nation, conceived in Liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal.

Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation, or any nation so conceived and so dedicated, can long endure. We are met on a great battle-field of that war. We have come to dedicate a portion of that field, as a final resting place for those who here gave their lives that that nation might live. It is altogether fitting and proper that we should do this. But, in a larger sense, we can not dedicate -- we can not consecrate -we can not hallow -- this ground.

The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have consecrated it, far above our poor power to add or detract. The world will little note, nor long remember what we say here, but it can never forget what they did here. It is for us the living, rather, to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they who fought here have thus far so nobly advanced. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us -- that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion --

that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain --

that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom and that government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth.
