<u>Acts</u> chapters **1-2** (2:1-47)

- 1 When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place.
- And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting.
- 3 And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them.
- 4 And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.

There are four things you need to know about Pentecost that will help you understand Acts 2.



1. Pentecost was a pilgrim festival.

That meant that according to Jewish Law, all the adult Jewish men would come from wherever they were living to Jerusalem and personally be in attendance during this celebration.



2. Pentecost was a holiday.

No servile work was to be done.
School was out.
The shops were closed.
It was party time.



3. There were certain celebrations, sacrifices and offerings which were prescribed in the Law for the day of Pentecost.

On Pentecost, the High Priest was to take two loaves of freshly baked wheat bread and offer them before the Lord. The wheat bread was made from the newly harvested wheat of

the 'early harvest'.

In short, Pentecost in the time of the Apostles was a great and grand harvest celebration. The streets of Jerusalem were clogged with thousands of pilgrims who had come from every point of the compass to celebrate the goodness of God and the bringing in of the wheat harvest.



4. Pentecost celebrates the giving of the Torah to Moses on Mt. Sinai.

Exactly seven weeks after the exodus began and the Israelites having prepared their hearts, God gave them the ten essential commandments.



With a touch of divine irony, on the very day that Jews from around the world gathered in Jerusalem to reaffirm their commitment to the covenant of Moses, the Holy Spirit descended upon Israel to offer the promise of the New Covenant to all who will believe. This new covenant makes Torah a matter of the heart, written by the God's Spirit, that yields a life fruitful in the praise of God.

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
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
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
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- 12 And all were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, "What does this mean?"

 And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved.



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
