



Does Essence precede Existence or does Existence precede Essence?

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
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a propositional truth that leaves the individual to either accept or reject but does not forfeit its content as absolute.

John 18:33-40

It is the existential question of every generation.

John 18:33-40

33 So Pilate entered his headquarters again and called Jesus and said to Him, "Are you the King of the Jews?"

34 Jesus answered, "Do you say this of your own accord, or did others say it to you about me?"

35 Pilate answered, "Am I a Jew? Your own nation and the chief priests have delivered you over to me. What have you done?"
36 Jesus answered, "My kingdom is not of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would have been fighting, that I might not be delivered over to the Jews. But my kingdom is not from the world."

37 Then Pilate said to him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this purpose I was born and for this purpose I have come into the world--to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice."

John 14:1-6

It is personified as an essential and exclusive characteristic of the divine.

John 14:1-6

- 1 "Let not your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me.
 2 In my Father's house are many rooms. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?
- **3** And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, that where I am you may be also.
- 4 And you know the way to where I am going."
- **5** Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?"
- **6** Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and **the truth**, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

John 8:31-36

It is the essence that guides a life of intrinsic meaning and purpose.

John 8:31-36

- 31 So Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in Him,
 - "If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples,
- and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."33 They answered Him,

"We are offspring of Abraham and have never been enslaved to anyone. How is it that you say, 'You will become free'?"

34 Jesus answered them,

"Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin.

- **35** The slave does not remain in the house forever; the son remains forever.
- **36** So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.

3 John 1:1-4

It is the confidence that 'reality is our friend', and God's reality is the blueprint for joy.

3 John 1:1-4

 The elder to the beloved Gaius, whom I love in truth.
 Beloved, I pray that all may go well with you and that you may be in good health, as it goes well with your soul.
 For I rejoiced greatly when the brothers came and testified to your truth, as indeed you are walking in the truth.
 I have no greater joy than to hear that my children are walking in the truth. The source of absolute truth is rooted in the nature and character of God and is revealed and expressed in His person and in His creation. When our experiences runs contrary to the nature and character of God, revealed and expressed in His person and in His creation, the conflict is rooted in our own personal brokenness.
