Matthew 9:1-8... In Capernaum Jesus healed the paralytic who had been brought to Him by friends...but the point of the healing and the story is that Jesus possessed and demonstrated that He had **authority to forgive sins**... a right that only God possesses.

A Tax Collector (a 'publican') was a Jewish contractor whose responsibility it was to collect taxes on behalf of the Roman government and make a 'commission' by padding the tax with extra for himself. These people were seen as traitors and despicable. Many, or most, made a handsome profit that necessitated Roman protection but found themselves totally disenfranchised from their countrymen.

Tax Collectors were almost always lumped in with 'sinners', a designation for those who were identified with the most immoral and the most degenerate of the people of Israel. Most often the part of their culture involved in prostitution was the focus of this designation as 'sinners', placing them in a position of rejection and judgment.

<u>John 1:35-46</u>

- 35 The next day again John was standing with two of his disciples,
- 36 and he looked at Jesus as He walked by and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God!"
- **37** The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus.
- 38 Jesus turned and saw them following and said to them,
 - "What are you seeking?"
