


Crucifixion: Matthew 27

- **45** Now from the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land until the ninth hour.
- **46** And about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, "Eli, Eli, Iema sabachthani?" that is, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"
- 47 And some of the bystanders, hearing it, said, "This man is calling Elijah."
- **48** And one of them at once ran and took a sponge, filled it with sour wine, and put it on a reed and gave it to Him to drink.
- 49 But the others said, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to save him."
- 50 And Jesus cried out again with a loud voice and yielded up His spirit.
- **51** And behold, the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. And the earth shook, and the rocks were split.
- **52** The tombs also were opened. And many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised,
- **53** and coming out of the tombs after His resurrection they went into the holy city and appeared to many.
- 54 When the centurion and those who were with Him, keeping watch over Jesus, saw the earthquake and what took place, they were filled with awe and said, "Truly this was the Son of God!"

Resurrection: Matthew 28

- 1 Now after the Sabbath, toward the dawn of the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb.
- 2 And behold, there was a **great earthquake**, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone and sat on it.
- 3 His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow.
- **4** And for fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men.
- **5** But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified.
- 6 He is not here, for He has risen,
 - For thus says the LORD of hosts: Yet once more, in a little while, I will shake the heavens and the earth and the sea and the dry land.

When Jesus returns to earth: Matthew 24

- 29 "Immediately after the tribulation of those days the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will fall from heaven, and the powers of the heavens will be shaken.
- **30** Then will appear in heaven the sign of the Son of Man, and then all the tribes of the earth will mourn, and they will see the Son of Man coming on the clouds of heaven with power and great glory.
- **31** And he will send out his angels with a loud trumpet call, and they will gather his elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other

When Jesus returns to earth (battle of Armageddon): Zechariah 14

- **1** Behold, a day is coming for the LORD, when the spoil taken from you will be divided in your midst.
- **2** For I will gather all the nations against Jerusalem to battle, and the city shall be taken and the houses plundered and the women raped. Half of the city shall go out into exile, but the rest of the people shall not be cut off from the city.
- 3 Then the LORD will go out and fight against those nations as when he fights on a day of battle.
- **4** On that day His feet shall stand on the Mount of Olives that lies before Jerusalem on the east, and **the Mount of Olives shall be split in two from east to west** by a very wide valley, so that one half of the Mount shall move northward, and the other half southward.

John 2:18-22

- 13 The Passover of the Jews was at hand, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.
- **14** In the temple He found those who were selling oxen and sheep and pigeons, and the money-changers sitting there.
- **15** And making a whip of cords, He drove them all out of the temple, with the sheep and oxen. And He poured out the coins of the money-changers and overturned their tables.
- 16 And He told those who sold the pigeons,
 - "Take these things away; do not make my Father's house a house of trade."
- 17 His disciples remembered that it was written, "Zeal for your house will consume me."
- 18 So the Jews said to Him, "What sign do you show us for doing these things?"
- 19 Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up."
- 20 The Jews then said, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and will you raise it up in three days?"
- 21 But He was speaking about the temple of His body.
- 22 When therefore He was raised from the dead, His disciples remembered that He had said this, and they believed the Scripture and the word that Jesus had spoken.
