#### Romans 1-6

- 1: God's general indictment against humanity.
- 2: God's indictment against you and me because we know the Law.
- 3: No one is righteous based on their works, but through faith in Christ.4: Abraham was justified by faith, not through works.
- 5: Having been justified by faith in Christ, we how have peace with God.
- 6: We can now live by the Spirit, having been set free from sin.

### Romans 7:15-25

- 15 I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do ...
- 18 For I know that good itself does not dwell in me, that is, in my sinful nature. For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out.
- 19 For I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want to do – this I keep on doing ...


### Romans 7:15-25

- **21** So I find this law at work: Although I want to do good, evil is right there with me.
- 22 For in my inner being I delight in God's law;
- 23 but I see another law at work in me, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin at work within me.
  24 What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me from this body that is subject to death?
- 25 Thanks be to God, who delivers me through Jesus Christ our Lord! So then, I myself in my mind am a slave to God's law, but in my sinful nature a slave to the law of sin.

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## Genesis 3:7-10

- 7 Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made coverings for themselves.
- 8 Then the man and his wife heard the sound of the LORD God as he was walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and they hid from the LORD God among the trees of the garden.
- 9 But the LORD God called to the man, "Where are you?"
  10 He answered, "I heard you in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid."

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# Genesis 3:11-13

11 And he said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have <u>you</u> eaten from the tree that I commanded you not to eat from?"
12 The man said, "The woman <u>you</u> put here with me - <u>she</u> gave me

some fruit from the tree, and I ate it."

13 Then the LORD God said to the woman, "What is this you have done?" The woman said, "The <u>serpent</u> deceived me, and I ate."

- **3** The teachers of the law and the Pharisees brought in a woman caught in adultery. They made her stand before the group
- **4** and said to Jesus, "Teacher, this woman was caught in the act of adultery.
- 5 In the Law Moses commanded us to stone such women. Now what do you say?"
- 6 They were using this question as a trap, in order to have a basis for accusing him. But Jesus bent down and started to write on the ground with his finger.

- 7 When they kept on questioning him, he straightened up and said to them, "Let any one of you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her."
- 8 Again he stooped down and wrote on the ground.
- **9** At this, those who heard began to go away one at a time, the older ones first, until only Jesus was left, with the woman still standing there.
- 10 Jesus straightened up and asked her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?"
- 11 "No one, sir," she said.

"Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared. "Go now and leave your life of sin."

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### Matthew 7:1-2,5

- **1** "Do not judge, or you too will be judged.
- 2 For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you.
- 5 You hypocrite, first **take the plank out of your own eye**, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye.

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## I Corinthians 4:3-4

- 3 I care very little if I am judged by <u>you</u> or by any human court; indeed, I do not even judge <u>myself</u>.
- 4 My conscience is clear, but that does not make me innocent. It is <u>the</u> <u>Lord</u> who judges me.
- 10 Jesus straightened up and asked her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?"
- 11 "No one, sir," she said. "Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared. "Go now and leave your life of sin."

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## Romans 7:22-8:1
