Being a follower of Christ is not about "trying harder" but it is about patiently and tenaciously "staying connected" to the source... ...the source of life which is found in Christ... ...He is the 'logos'.... ...the Word.... ...the Truth... ...the Life.



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Logos is the Greek term translated as "word," "speech," "principle," or "thought." In Greek philosophy, it also referred to a universal, divine reason or the mind of God.

In the New Testament, the Gospel of John begins,

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and without Him was not any thing made that was made.

In Him was life, and the life was the light of men". (John 1:1-4)

Here it is clear that the "Word" or Logos is a reference to Jesus Christ.

John argues that Jesus, the Word or Logos, is eternal and is God.

Further, all creation came about by and through Jesus, who is presented as the source of life. Amazingly, this Logos came and lived among us:

"And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, the glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth". (John 1:14)

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John's Gospel begins by using the Greek idea of a "divine reason" or "the mind of God" as a way to connect with the readers of his day and introduce Jesus to them as God.

Greek philosophy may have used the word in reference to divine reason, but John used it to note many of the attributes of Jesus.

In John's use of the Logos concept, we find that:

- -Jesus is eternal
- -Jesus was with God prior to coming to earth
- -Jesus is God
- -Jesus is Creator
- -Jesus is the Giver of Life
- -Jesus became human to live among us

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("In the beginning was the Word")
("the Word was with God")
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("All things were made through Him")

Abide in Christ and in His Word (Spirit-filled life).

Bear fruit that can only be real if you stay connected to the source.

Glorify God by simply letting Him do what only He can do in your life.

The one who abides in Christ is called His friend.

The highest calling is to give yourself to love as you have been loved.

These things I command you, so that you will love one another.

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Our society is better at the soft virtues— compassion and mercy, than at the hard virtues— like chastity and honesty.



By personality and upbringing and a whole bunch of other factors most of us lean in one direction or the other.



They are always welcoming. But without truth, grace isn't really grace, it's just being accepting and nice. But affirmation and being grace-filled are not the same thing. **Grace people without truth are pleasant to** be around, but we wonder if they really like us or if they are just trying to be liked.



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
They are tolerant, but they often do not know the difference between right and wrong. Or they don't care to line up one way or the other. Grace people can be cowardly. They often refuse to make tough decisions in life. They demand nothing from others and get nothing in return. They accept us for who we are, but they never help us become who we should be.

And then there are truth people.

Truth people are easy to admire.

They have convictions and principles.

They believe in right and wrong. They set standards. They speak out against injustice, oppression, and evil. They are articulate and well-spoken. But without grace, telling the truth can become an excuse for belligerence. Truth people without grace are loyal to their cause, but we wonder if they are really loyal to us.




If you are a grace person you are most concerned about being loved.

Something is wrong if everyone hates you, and something is probably just as wrong if everyone loves you.




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


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


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



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
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

1 Therefore you have no excuse, O man, every one of you who judges. For in passing judgment on another you condemn yourself, because you, the judge, practice the very same things.


- **2** We know that the judgment of God rightly falls on those who practice such things.

8 but for those who are self-seeking and do not obey the truth, but obey unrighteousness, there will be wrath and fury.



What can you do to be a more integrated person for the good of those you interact with and out of reverence for Christ?






Who have you devalued, degraded, demeaned or dehumanized that you need to change your heart about?




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
